Milixa Moron, Antonio Castillo, Marco Caridad. Allegories of the Real and the Supernatural By Felix Suazo

[The numinous] "can only be evoked, awakened in the mind ..." "It is the emotion of a creature, submerged and overwhelmed by its own nothingness in contrast to that which is supreme above all creatures." Rudolf Otto

Immersed in an unstable reality, the contemporary subject is thrown out in the open. Hungry for answers, he seeks discernment in nature and in myths. There he finds the ineffable keys to his past and the inextricable augury of the future. But this struggle between opacity and lucidity is always a personal challenge, in which each person is the protagonist of his own drama on the stage of life.

Three Latino artists living in the USA explore the meaning of beliefs and their personal implication. Milixa Morón (Barquisimeto, 1977), Antonio Castillo (Santiago, 1991) and Marco Caridad (Maracaibo, 1985) bring their works together in the group exhibition "Three Powers", where each of them breaks down significant aspects of identity, both individual and collective. What gives unity to their approaches are their spiritual concerns, in which elements associated with nature, sexuality and myths intersect.

Painter and drawer, Milixa Morón recreates in her work some of the popular beliefs from her native land. The legend of María Lionza —protector deity of waters, nature and love—, as well as the Diablos Danzantes de Yare —local version of the Corpus Christi festivity—, represent for her the link with her tradition of origin. Femininity, myths and nature delineate her research, to which are added elements of everyday life and concerns of her condition as a mother, wife and artist. Hence, her portraits often personify the image of her heroines. Her work is also characterized by her constant evocations of the aquatic world, both in domestic life and in the spiritual sense.

Antonio Castillo gives a personal significance to the pyromantic celebrations of San Juan Bautista and the advent of the winter solstice in the southern hemisphere. In Chile, his country of origin, it is a magical moment in which the earthly and the celestial come into contact, bonfires are made as a sign of purification and wishes are burned. His paintings are part of a promising ritual, sustained in a probabilistic grid where images and premonitions are concatenated. These works are compositions elaborated from the experiential and the non-verbalizable, containing diverse elements —linear reiterations, knots, chains, looping traces, words—, in which the reciprocal pulsation of longings and the happiness received can be seen.

Marco Caridad takes up the Mayan myth of the twin brothers, who defeated the lords of the underworld, died in the fire and were reincarnated as the sun and the moon. From this premise, the artist addresses the conflict of the binary of gender and gender identity. In his work, images and words form a counterpoint between the opposite and the complementary. The questions and their possible answers cover different areas of the author's experience, related to his pre-Hispanic ancestors, his condition as a migrant and his sexual affinity. Using digital media, video and performance, the artist stages the question of dualism and self-affirmation. In his case, the luminescent tremor of a candle flame is the only oracle in the midst of uncertainty.

In the "Three Powers" project, Milixa Morón, Antonio Castillo and Marco Caridad offer their own version of the beliefs that stimulate and sustain them. Each one has his own altar, outside the normative faith and away from the blind devotion to a single entity, but they have in common the immeasurable force of the spiritual. The triad they form evokes sacred geometry and the power of ritual as a creative incentive.

They are driven by magic; that which introduces the supernatural into the real, which interpolates the time of the gods into the finitude of human aspirations and which —in the end— makes existence a prodigy. Nothing is as magical as life manifesting itself in its material and symbolic fullness. Nothing is as revealing as the creative imagination when it shows the invisible, unveils the hidden and makes the unintelligible legible.


1. 2022. "The dancing spirits". Mixed media/watercolor paper. 60 x 40 in.

In Milixa's community, there is a tradition of dressing up like monsters and performing a ritual dance to ward off evil. Her painting portrays "The dancing spirits" participating in this tradition, and through it, Milixa expresses her beliefs and identity.

> Milixa's artwork captures the essence of the phrase "Holy water!" which highlights the significance of something when it is scarce, particularly something as fundamental as water. The struggle for access to clean water in Latin America is a daily reality, and people can truly appreciate its value when it becomes available. In her piece, Milixa portrays her father taking a bath using the water he was able to collect, demonstrating his optimistic outlook on life despite limited resources.

Milixa's artwork "Yara," portrays the goddess of nature, also known as Maria Lionza, who is a mythological figure with roots in reality as the daughter of a Cacique, or native Indian chief. This piece is part of Milixa's self-portrait series and serves as an allegory for her connection to nature and the spiritual world.


Three Powers Antonio Castillo



"BELIEVES" is a profoundly personal video art piece that invites viewers to meditate on their spiritual journey and beliefs, particularly in Latin society, where Catholicism and other folkloric religions are prevalent. As a queer artist who grew up in a Catholic family, the artist uses the candle as a powerful symbol to explore the complexities of spirituality and religious belief. The flickering flame and abstracted images represent the fragility of faith in the face of uncertainty. Through this piece, the artist hopes to spark a dialogue around the many questions we confront when accepting who we are.

These series of prints created by Marco Caridad explores themes of self-acceptance, personal identity, and cultural heritage.On his research, the artist draws inspiration from studying he pre-Hispanic ancestors and their perspectives on gender and sexuality. The representation of two men as world creators in the Popol Vuh resonated with him as a powerful affirmation of his identity.
